• **I John** **The Life (1:1)**

• **II John** **The Truth (1)**

The elder, To the lady chosen by God and to her children, whom I love in the truth—and not I only, but also all who know the truth—² because of the truth, which lives in us and will be with us forever:

• **III John** **The Way (1:4)**

I have no greater joy than to hear that my children are walking in the truth.

What does this passage teach you about Christ?

• **Jude** **Our Advocate (24)**

To him who is able to keep you from stumbling and to present you before his glorious presence without fault and with great joy.

What does this passage teach you about Christ?

• **Revelation** **King of Kings and Lord of Lords (19:16)**

On his robe and on his thigh he has this name written:

“KING OF KINGS AND LORD OF LORDS”
